Program Description

This university-wide certificate is administered through the School of Social Transformation (SST) and academic advising is offered through the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences. This certificate program introduces students to the identities, experiences and lives of LGBTQ+ people in the United States and internationally. The philosophy of this certificate program is to promote intellectual and pedagogical diversity as one of the university's greatest assets.

Courses that satisfy this certificate introduce students to the complex intersections between and among sexual, racial, ethnic, religious, geographic, and national identities.

COM 316: Gender and Communication

Capstone (3 credit hours)

All students complete a capstone project including a public presentation, which is supervised by any member of the faculty approved by the LGBT studies certificate
